## Training levels

**Level One** - Familiarisation training

**Level Two** - Can perform the task correctly, although not with the speed and polished skill required on the job.

**Level Three** - Can perform the task at the level of accuracy and speed required on the job.

**Level Four** - Additional practice after they reach level three to produce a higher retention of learning.
